



COURTESY LICENSE (21 DAYS)

Subject to the restrictions set out below, the Registrar may issue a courtesy license (21 days), for no more than 21 days per calendar year, to a psychologist who is licensed and in good standing in another jurisdiction and who wishes to practice psychology in New Brunswick on a temporary basis.

To obtain a courtesy license, a psychologist from another jurisdiction must provide:

- _____ (1) a confirmation of licensure in good standing in their respective jurisdiction,
- _____ (2) proof that the psychologist is not the subject of a pending disciplinary action in another jurisdiction, does not have any past or outstanding complaints and that there are no conditions or restrictions on the Registrant.
- _____ (3) the intended dates of work in New Brunswick. If unable to provide the dates at the time of the application, the applicant should inform the College as soon as the dates are known in order to validate the courtesy license,
- _____ (4) a full description of the nature of the work to be done while in New Brunswick.
- _____ (5) a copy of proof of professional liability insurance as outlined on page 15 of the CPNB By-Laws.

All information must be received by the Registrar before the application is reviewed and a courtesy license is issued. A letter with the seal of the CPNB will constitute the courtesy license (21 days).
